Sunday bike rides

Fun Facts

- ◆ The three most famous types of bicycles in the first 40 years of bicycle history were the French Boneshaker, the English Penny-Farthing and the Rover Safety Bicycle.
- ◆ Cycling as a popular pastime and competitive sport developed during the late 19th century in England.
- ◆ The most famous bicycle race in the world is the Tour de France, established in 1903. Cyclists from all over the world take part in this three-week event.
- ◆ One of the most important discoveries in the history of bicycles was the pneumatic tire, invented by John Boyd Dunlop in 1887.
- ◆ Cycling is one of the best pastimes for people who want to reduce the risk of heart disease and stroke.

Aug. 4: Glacial Drumlin to Delafield: We will ride on the Glacial Drumlin, Paul Sandegren and Lake Country trails from Wales to Delafield. Trail passes can be obtained at the start point for the Glacial Drumlin Trail portion, (**\$5/day or \$25/annual**).

Meet at the Wales Glacial Drumlin trailhead, at 319 James St., Wales, at 1:30 p.m. and be ready to ride by 1:45. There are bathrooms and water at the trailhead. We will also make a

Aug. 11: Seven Waters Trail: We will meet at Case Eagle Park, 310 S. Rochester St., in Rochester. We will bike north from there to a point near the Racine County / Waukesha County Line. The ride is almost 19 miles round trip. This trail is mostly flat on asphalt and hard-packed gravel surfaces. Afterward, we can go to Doc's on the Fox Bar and Grill, 232 N. Milwaukee St. in Waterford.

Is there a star on your license?

If you are flying within the U.S. after May 7, 2025, you will need a "Real ID" as an added security measure. Wisconsin began issuing Real ID driver licenses several years ago, so you may have received one the last time you renewed; it would have a star in the upper right corner. If you aren't sure if you have a Real ID, check trust.dot.state.wi.us/ecdl/home.do.

Your license will still be valid without Real ID even after the deadline. But you would need to use a passport at the airport.
